1. Minutes

- Minutes of the October 7, 2009, meeting were approved.

2. Joint Program Implementation Updates

- **Presentation by Initiative G2:** Overview of the LADWP CFL distribution program and other capabilities for integrated program management support. Vendor shared their approach to driving adoption of residential energy-efficiency and water reduction programs. G2 working on developing partnerships with auditors and installers.
- **Workforce Training Programs:** Craig will gather the existing initiatives as well as the overlap and potential for application for various Stimulus funding opportunities.

3. PBC Reporting

- The CEC has begun "kick-off" meetings for EECBG report programs and reporting.

4. Legislative Update

- **AB 920** (Conference Call with Justin Wynne of Braun Blasing McLaughlin):
 - Clarification of law included applicability for systems under 10 kW
 - By Jan 10, 2010, utility needs to inform customers of option of either a twelve-month true-up credit (paid at an avoided cost, not retail rate), or to continue the revolving kWh credit.

- **State Energy Plan (SEP):** Pre-bid meeting was held October 20, and SCPPA has submitted a Letter of Intent (LOI) for all three categories (\$20M each). Application development has begun, and SCPPA will organize the balance of input from Members.
 - Municipal Financing
 - Residential Program (provide info on GHHC to Dave Walden)
 - Municipal and Commercial Retrofits.
- **FOA 119 State Energy Efficiency Appliance Rebate Program (SEEARP):**
 - \$35 M statewide to support rebates for:
 1. **Refrigerators** meeting specific requirements (likely to use Super-Efficient Home Appliance Initiative Tier 2 and Tier 3 criteria) \$75 proposed
 2. **Room A/C Units** meeting specific requirements (likely to use Super-Efficient Home Appliance Initiative Tier 2 and Tier 3 criteria) \$50 proposed
 3. **Clothes Washers** with Energy Star and 6.0 Water Factor (really high) \$100 proposed
 - Cost-sharing program, so this would be in addition to our own rebates plus we do all the marketing. The proposed dishwasher and clothes washer rebates could bundle with any existing appliance rebates.
 - These extra rebates would only be available from April 22-May 30, 2010.
 - If we want to be a partner, we'd need to get a commitment letter in to CEC before Nov. 30 with program details for inclusion in the DOE application. (Jan Roosevelt to lead the program and discussions with Lorraine White.)

5. **New Business**

- **Solar Electric Power Association (SEPA) Conference:** Gerald Katz reported on SEPA Conference held in Anaheim, October 26-28. Approximately 25,000 attendees, 900 vendors and 150 module brands represented.
- **Association of Women in Water, Energy and Environment Conference:** Adrienne Rogers reported on this association's first conference, held October 21-22, 2009, in San Diego.
- **"Keep Your Cool:"** This is an NCPA program, seeking a SCPPA letter of support for funding for a commercial refrigeration energy efficiency program, targeted at food service and grocery stores.
